REPORT ON THE PROVISION OF CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

2014-2015

EVALUATION OF CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

Below are the main conclusions of an invitation to all staff to reflect on and evaluate CPD for 2014-2015:

Active Learning Methodologies Using ICT in the Classroom and IT in Assessment for Learning and Assessment of Learning: One participant reported that the presentation content and the presenter's knowledge and delivery were excellent. However, the computer equipment available at the centre was dated. While the material covered was very beneficial, sessions at 7pm in the evening, after a long school day, were not ideal. Another participant, while very impressed with ontent and the presenter's knowledge and delivery, also remarked that the computer room at the centre was very small and confined. The internet connection was not fast enough to allow full access to all websites and programmes. However, the ideas and content were very practical and useful. A third participant said that the only negative was that the computers/internet didn't work properly for all attending the course. She has already used some of the resources recommended and anticipates using more of them. Yet another participant reported:

"Active learning and ICT, Finding and Selection information. Excellent course with great methodologies on how to implement active learning using ICT and find info on web. Great resources that could be shared with whole staff and implemented with students, Padlet, Animoto, cube creator, free rice etc. (5/5 on all parts of evaluation form)

AFL in the Classroom: another great in-service that introduced strategies for AFL. A lot of the strategies are already being used in Athy College. Some simple and useful new strategies given which when tested on students got positive feedback . 5/5 on all parts of evaluation form."

Project Maths CPD/ Maths. The Project Maths s Autumn 2014 and Spring 2015 were very good/excellent in all respects.

The presentation content on Inferential Statistics was excellent as was the presenter's knowledge. However, the overall delivery was poor and while the venue was very good, all expectations were not met.

Post Graduate Diploma in Special Educational Needs: (St. Angela's College, Sligo)

The participant felt the course was very beneficial in enabling her to meet the holistic need of learners with SEN. It built her confidence in engaging in student profiling and IEP planning. The 3 support visits from college personnel to the school were very helpful. Overall, excellent in every way.

Movement and Drawing Exercises to help Development and Learning Difficulties: "Very informative. Totally new information was included and delivered in a very practical way. Theory followed by practice. Have put skills into practice in the classroom. "the content of this CPD was shared with at the mentoring group sessions and also at a whole-staff CPD on T&L.

French: Classroom Miscellany for the Junior Cert French Classroom – An excellent course as it gave a hands-on, practical overview of strategies and activities that can be used in the French classroom. The teachers have used may of the strategies and has found them useful.

LCA Vocational Preparation Task: The attendee found this workshop in January 2015 particularly helpful in relation to the presentation of task work.

Support for Inclusive Teaching and Learning: For the Biology workshop the venue was excellent, the presenter's knowledge and delivery were very good and the presentation content was good.

JCSP Co-Ordinators' Meetings: These meetings were very good in all respects.

Chemistry: CPD on Equilibrium and Chemistry Methods – excellent CPD

Science: Course on Amgen Teach: Inquiry based teaching and learning in Science was excellent in all respects.

French/Spanish: ICT Supporting Modern Language in Teaching and Learning: "This course covered websites that can be used for teaching a modern foreign language. Only one of the websites presented (out of four) was useful, but that website has been used a lot in my classes since the course and students love it, so overall the course was very worthwhile."

Home Economics: Association of Teachers of Home Economics: "Baking demonstration by "RTE's: The Restaurant" chef was great as she focused on JCSP Home Economics, demonstrating simple recipes and decorations that could be made to gain students' interest in the subject. Great input on Leaving Cert. Social Studies from a solicitor. She focused on Family Law in Ireland.
