EVALUATION

Professional Qualifications:

The Level 9 PGD in learning support/resource and special educational needs "was very comprehensive, targeting a broad range of areas and issues within the post-primary and special school setting. There were also clear guidelines around the setting up of a special educational needs support team within a school with clearly identifiable personnel responsible for specific areas".

School Planning - SSE/Literacy and Numeracy/Curriculum Development

The in-service provided on SSE and integrating the SSE process into whole school planning was excellent in every respect.

Whole staff training on the New Junior Cycle proved "very informative".

Training in the area of Junior Cycle Literacy for all teachers included "some very useful strategies to promote literacy, many of which have been adopted in different subject areas". CPD attended on "The Role of the Year Head" was excellent in every respect.

Programme-Based CPD:

JCSP Co-Ordinators CPD: "Great to meet with other coordinators and hear what is going on in other schools". The CPD on Assessment in JCSP was "a most informative day, great to get a fuller picture on the assessment requirements to fulfill and record JCSP statement completion. Also it was a great opportunity to talk to other teachers from other schools in relation to their JCSP and LCA programmes".

LCVP: The CPD on 2016 Case Study was excellent.

Subject-Based CPD

Art : CPD on Leaving Cert Art Assessment "Straightforward and clear description (as far as had been decided on at that point by the DES) provided of the changes to come, including examples of artwork produced during the pilot programme." The Art Teachers' Association Conference was "a very enjoyable and worthwhile day including updates on development in

the contemporary art world; showcasing examples of selected Junior Cert and Leaving Cert work from around the country; workshops (3 to be selected from a number of options) which provided opportunity to up-skill in new creative areas; and time to meet other art teachers and discuss and share classroom ideas".

Biology: CPD "excellent. Well organised and some great ideas for teaching".

Business Studies: The JCT for Business studies "offered great insight into the layout and content of the new Business Studies course. It also supplied ideas and resources for the teaching of this subject".

Chemistry: Summer school "was great for keeping up-to-date with current issues in chemistry and also related the subject to industry". "Chemistry in-service in Kilkenny Education Centre was excellent as always, providing great resources".

DCG: CPD on solidworks updates was excellent in every respect.

History: LC History DBQ in-service was information and covered the DBQ quite well. The HTAI Conference had some useful input on practical methodologies and strategies in teaching LC and JC History. The PDST course on using ICT in JC History was "excellent, full of practical ideas, in particular ICT in Junior history classes".

Science: JCT on new Junior Cycle. While the presenter's knowledge and delivery were good, the course did not fully meet teacher's expectations in terms of content and "a lot of questions could not be answered; not given definite guidelines about the depth the teachers should go into on topics - told 'whatever you feel' ".

SKILLS:

ICT : Finding and Selecting Information : Delivered early in the school year, this CPD was "very helpful". Another participant reported that he had used some of the sources throughout the school year. "Great to get official certification for a course undertaken in our own school".

First Aid : This course addressed an identified need in staff training. It was reported to be "very useful, very good delivery and very relevant".
